SAMUEL H. MILLER TO BE HONORED AT PEOPLE OF VISION AWARD DINNER

CLEVELAND – Samuel H. Miller, Co-Chairman of the Board & Treasurer of Forest City Enterprises Inc., will be recognized for outstanding leadership, community involvement and philanthropic vision at Prevent Blindness Ohio's 12th Annual People of Vision Award Dinner. Medical Mutual of Ohio and its Chairman, President and CEO Kent W. Clapp will host the gala dinner at Executive Caterers at Landerhaven from 5:30 p.m. – 8:00 p.m. on Thursday, May 24, 2007. Larry Morrow, a broadcaster for the Larry Morrow Group Inc., will emcee the event.

The People of Vision Award was established in 1985 by Prevent Blindness Ohio to recognize selected Ohio corporations and their top leadership for outstanding community vision. The People of Vision Award Dinner is certain to be one of northeast Ohio's premier charitable events. Companies, organizations and individuals can purchase tables or seats to the dinner. More than 250 community leaders are expected to attend the event and raise more than \$161,000 gross to support the sight-saving programs of Prevent Blindness Ohio.

Prevent Blindness Ohio's mission is to prevent blindness and preserve sight through advocacy, research and early detection. Prevent Blindness Ohio provides direct services to more than 800,000 Ohioans annually and arms millions of consumers with information to preserve their precious gift of sight. Last year, Prevent Blindness Ohio provided access to comprehensive eye exams and eyeglasses to 5,465 medically indigent adults and children.

More Ohioans than ever are facing the threat of blindness from age-related eye disease. In Cuyahoga County, more than 356,000 adults have vision impairment and age-related eye diseases including cataracts, glaucoma, age-related macular degeneration and diabetic retinopathy.

Statewide, one out of every four school-aged children has a vision problem that may be undetected or untreated. In Ohio, approximately 6% of children *enter school each year* with undetected and untreated vision problems. If left untreated, these vision problems can cause permanent damage to their eyes and impede their success in school.

Prevent Blindness Ohio is celebrating 50 years as Ohio's leading volunteer nonprofit public health organization dedicated to preventing blindness and preserving sight. Founded in 1957 by U.S. Senator John Bricker and Lion's Club Member Bob Morrison with support from Nationwide, the Ohio Department of Health and Delta Gamma Fraternity, the Northeast Ohio Chapter was established in 1993 by the following founders: Cole National, Forest City Enterprises Inc., KeyBank, Liggett Stashower, Careerboard.com, University Hospitals-Department of Ophthalmology and Northeast Ohio Neighborhood Health Services. From the beginning, Prevent Blindness Ohio's mission has remained steadfast – *to prevent blindness and preserve sight*. Our goal is to prevent the 50% of vision loss that is needless and *help all Ohioans enjoy good sight for life!*
