2006 - 2007 In-Sights

👁 182 volunteers dedicated 1,398 hours to accomplish 128 preschool vision screening programs in the Greater Milwaukee area.

👁 35 volunteers dedicated 336 hours to conduct 30 preschool vision screening programs in Dane County.

👁 26 preschool vision screening programs were conducted, serving a total of 611 children in the Northeast Office area.

👁 43 Wisconsin Lions Clubs performed 139 preschool vision screening programs serving a total of 5,689 children across the state.

👁 66 Milwaukee Public Schools were screened through Prevent Blindness Wisconsin's e-Sight project.

👁 126 screening partners including public health nurses, school nurses and Head Start centers in 54 counties reported their statistics to PBW. A total of 157,506 students received vision screenings.

👁 Prevent Blindness Wisconsin provides free vision screening materials and educational brochures to agencies that conduct vision screening programs. In addition PBW distributed materials at professional conferences, trainings, health fairs, and workshops. During fiscal year 2006 – 2007 approximately 60,000 pieces were distributed.
